Farmland Preservation Program — The State of Wisconsin (DATCP) has recently accepted the Winnebago County Farmland Preservation Plan. Since Nepeuskun has its own zoning, it must now adopt an ordinance and have it certified by the State. This is in process and hopefully will be completed by the end of the year so that the \$7.50 per acre tax credit may be available for 2012 to those landowners who signed up.

VOTE - VOTE – VOTE

Tuesday, November 6, 2012 is the date for the fall “Presidential” election. The ballot will include the following offices: President/Vice President, US Senator, Representative in Congress, State Senator – District 18, Representative to the State Assembly – District 53, District Attorney, County Clerk, County Treasurer and County Register of Deeds. Voter registration will be required for anyone not previously registered within the Town of Nepeuskun. You must be a resident of the Town for 28 days before an election. Additional information can be found at <http://gab.wi.gov>. **Polls at the Town Hall will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.**

CONTROLLED BURNING – If you are starting a fire which you plan to control (brush, grass, clean wood from an old building, etc) you need to call the local fire department to inform them of the fire you will be having. You would then avoid the cost of a fire call if someone passing by or perhaps a neighbor would call it in. The phone number to call is **920-236-7300**. The Berlin or Ripon fire departments will be notified.

STRAY ANIMALS — If you are bothered by stray animals you should contact the Town Constable – Richard Fernau at 920-748-9427 or 920-585-8456. If you know the owner of the animal, a friendly call to the owner may be more effective and preserve a good relationship with your neighbor.

GARBAGE PICKUP – Garbage pickup is available in the Town. Contact Jon Schure for more information at 920-361-2970. Dumpster service for garbage is available in our town for a fee from Veolia and Waste Management. Talk to a neighbor to share the cost of a dumpster. Veolia (Omro), Waste Management (Berlin) or Winnebago County landfill (Oshkosh) have available garbage drop-off for a fee. Composting of organic post consumer waste is recommended.
