Rush Lake Project

At the Board of Directors meeting for Rush Lake Watershed Restoration, Inc., held on April 17, 2008, approval was given to hire Northern Environmental to do a post-drawdown vegetation survey. Northern Environmental will also provide a report that compares the vegetation types and densities from their survey prior to the drawdown and the survey to be done this summer. The dredging of the South landing is complete and work on the boat ramp is underway. Proposals for a boardwalk at the South and East landings were submitted by DNR staff for discussion purposes. On a sad note, longtime committee and board member from the Town of Utica, Lawrence Bradley, passed away on May 16. Lawrence will always be remembered for his passionate dedication to the Rush Lake project. Please contact the Rush Lake Watershed Restoration, Inc.
