Rush Lake Project

Rush Lake Project – The most recent meeting of Rush Lake Watershed Restoration, Inc. was held on March 17. A fundraiser, “Rush Lake Benefit Shoot”, will be held on June 4 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Berlin Conservation Club. On March 7, volunteers and DNR personnel cleared brush, overhanging trees and logs from the banks and streambed of Waukau Creek above the main dam and bypass channel at the carp pond in Waukau. This was to help correct the flow of the creek in this area so that the carp can more effectively be prevented from getting upstream. At the January 20, 2011 meeting, the RLWRI Board approved spending \$1,427.00 for new carp gates at the dam and bypass channel in Waukau, which have been installed. There have been several carp removal events at the South landing this winter where approx. 25,000 pounds of carp have been removed from Rush Lake. The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, June 16, at 7:00 p.m. at the Waukau Youth Center. Recycling News - As of January 1, 2011 oil filters and oil absorbent material can no longer be placed in landfills and must be recycled. It appears that the best option for Town residents will be to take oil filters and absorbent materials to the Winnebago County Landfill/Recycling Center at County Rd Y and Hwy 76 on the north side of Oshkosh. The first 4 oil filters are free with any additional ones charged for at 50 cents each. Oil absorbent materials can be dropped off at no charge.
