Rush Lake Project

Rush Lake Project – The most recent meeting of Rush Lake Watershed Restoration, Inc. was held April 15, 2010. Permits needed for dredging at the South landing have been obtained and work will be scheduled for the next several months. Don Metko desires to resign from the Board and President Doug Bohn will recommend to the Town of Rushford that Bruce Miller be his replacement. Vice- President Bahn reported that Rob Stone also wished to resign from the Board. (The Town Board approved Bob LaBuda as the new director to replace Rob Stone at its May 17th meeting). Use of the Federal dredging boat (“Swamp Devil”) from the Horicon Marsh was also discussed

with targeted areas mapped and discussed. A committee was formed to raise funds for cattail spraying. Concern of loss of open water due to cattail growth was made by a western shore landowner who claimed this has hampered his hunting methods. Repairs were made to the dam by the DNR to control water that was running around both ends. It was recommended by the Board that the water level be held at 1.0 on the gage at the dam until June 1st and that it then be held (if possible) at 1.2 on the gage through the fall hunting season. The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, July 15, 2010, 7:00 p.m. at the Waukau Youth Center. Please contact the Rush Lake Watershed Restoration, Inc. To all those who brought food items to the Town Hall during May recycling for the 4-H food drive.

Well Water Testing Program– The Town has investigated several private companies and public agencies that provide well water testing services. The DNR and EPA recommend well owners test their water annually. As a result, Clean Water Testing, LLC of Appleton, WI will be offering well water testing services to Town residents. The Town will only be coordinating the use of the Town Hall. This is an optional program, so if you choose to participate you will be responsible for the cost of the testing. Bacteria, nitrate and arsenic tests are available for the discounted price of \$15.00 each. Additional testing packages will also be available. Clean Water Testing will be at the Town Hall on Thursday, May 27th from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. If you wish to participate in the program, stop by the Town Hall that day to pick up a sample kit. You will be asked to take the kit home, fill up the sample bottles, and return it to the Town Hall that same day with payment. A full explanation of the testing options, pricing, and any other questions can be answered at this time. If there are enough participants, an educational meeting about your drinking water will be held 3-4 weeks later. **NOTE: We do need 50 participants in order to justify an educational meeting.** Results will be mailed otherwise.
